# **Current community leadership initiatives**

- ABACUS: Advancing post-secondary access. ABACUS is a partnership initiative of Hamilton Community Foundation and The Fairmount Foundation. Recognizing the impact that increased high school graduation and post-secondary access would have on Hamilton, ABACUS focuses on improving the academic, community and environmental factors that most directly affect the likelihood of students continuing their education. By starting intervention in the middle-school years, the goal is to help young Hamiltonians facing multiple barriers increasingly access post-secondary education. This year, HCF will grant over \$1 million from the Community Fund to ABACUS programs.
- Building healthy neighbourhoods. In 2002, HCF's launched a multi-year commitment to poverty reduction, focused on strengthening low-income neighbourhoods. Our ongoing commitment includes funding community development in collaboration with the City of Hamilton's Neighbourhood Action Strategy (NAS) and supporting the small grants program in each NAS neighbourhood. Part of our community knowledge role is to advance the consideration of mixed-income neighbourhoods and schools as a strategy in creating healthy places to live throughout the whole of Hamilton.
- Neighbourhood Leadership Institute: This program enhances the skills
  of neighbourhood and community leaders from the NAS communities.
  Students participate in leadership training while developing a local
  project idea.
- Hamilton Roundtable for Poverty Reduction: HCF and the City of
  Hamilton launched the Roundtable over a decade ago to focus on
  systemic-level change needed to reduce and eliminate poverty in
  Hamilton. As the 2015 recipient of the national Cities Reducing Poverty
  Award, the Roundtable continues to be acknowledged for its
  collaborative efforts to influence public policy and promote social
  inclusion.
- Women 4 Change. A collective giving initiative with the dual focus of increasing the capacity of women to be effective philanthropists and having a positive impact on the lives of Hamilton's women and girls.
- Impact investing. Impact investing is a way to put more of our assets to work in support of our mission, using strategies that target both financial returns and social impact. While the bulk of our endowment is currently invested in traditional markets, we are piloting direct impact investments and an ESG public market portfolio. Our impact investing portfolio also includes the \$5 million Hamilton Community Investment Fund which provides loans to local charities and non-profits. Currently our impact investing portfolio commitment is \$44.9 million.
